

Oral Presentation Guidelines

Oral presentations provide an opportunity to present research directly to the conference audience and to discuss findings with fellow researchers and delegates.

- **Presentation time:** Oral presentations are allotted **10 minutes each**.
- **Focus:** Presentations should concentrate on the most important aspects of the research and avoid attempting to cover unnecessary detail.
- **Suggested structure:** A clear presentation will normally include the background and objectives, methodology, key results and conclusions or implications.
- **Discussion:** Questions and discussion will take place **after all presentations in the session have been completed**, allowing delegates to consider the research presented across the session as a whole.
- **Audio-visual presentation:** Authors whose abstracts are accepted for oral presentation will also be required to submit the **15-minute pre-recorded audio-visual presentation** described above.
